

PROGRAM FOR A STUDENT WITH PHYSICAL IMPAIRMENT

Students with a mild physical impairment participate in all areas of the school curriculum and are involved in many extracurricular areas of school life. Students participate in a fully inclusive program and are supported by the Metropolitan Region Advisory Visiting Teacher Service.

Physically impaired students are identified through the Education Adjustment Program (EAP) process with a verification of their diagnosis and the completion of an educational Profile. Student needs and goals are identified in an Individual Learning Plan (ILP).

The support program aims to develop student independence and to ensure that they are given every opportunity to access, participate and succeed in the curriculum and to make a successful transition to post school pathways.

The Metropolitan North Region Special Education Programs for secondary aged students with high support needs for Physical Impairment are situated at Craigslea State High School and Ferny Grove State High Schools.
